Reading at Westacre Infant School

Literacy teaching involves the four elements of English: Speaking, Listening, Reading and Writing. We want our children to become: confident speakers, good listeners and readers who enjoy reading a range of genres.

We teach synthetic phonics using the Read Write Inc approach.

The children use Fred the Frog to help them break down words and then they help him to blend the different sounds.

You will be invited to a workshop in the Autumn Term to support your children with reading.
