Maths

We will be looking at the composition of numbers to 10. We will also be using the language more, fewer, less to compare amounts. We will be investigating weight encouraging comparisons and using the correct vocabulary such as heavy, heavier, light, lighter etc.

Key knowledge and skills:

To recall number bonds to 10 finding numbers that are more or less than a given number. To know that subitising is looking at number patterns. To count and understand ordinal numbers, knowing that the last number they say represents how many objects in a group.

Naming and describing 2D shape and looking at their characteristics. To know that not all bigger items are heavier than smaller items.
