## <u>Maths</u>

We will be completing our unit of work on Money. The small steps we will cover are:

- Calculate with money
- Make a pound
- Find change
- Two-step problems

Following this, we will begin our unit of work on Multiplication and Division. The small steps we will cover are:

- Recognise equal groups
- Make equal groups
- Add equal groups
- Introduce the multiplication symbol
- Multiplication sentences

## <u>English</u>

In English, we will be continuing our unit of work based on the text "Winnie in Winter" by Valerie Thomas and Korky Paul. We will be using the structure and vocabulary from this story to create and write an innovated wishing tale. We will then invent and write our own wishing tales. As writers, we will use the writing toolkit to ensure we include all of the writing skills we have been taught – including our new learning on possessive apostrophes and adverbs are included in our writing. We will edit and improve our work.

In spelling we will be revising our knowledge of the spelling rules for adding the -ed suffix to words. We will also be introduced to adding the suffixes -er and -est and spelling words with the r sound spelt wr, as in wrong, wrist, wrap, write, etc.
